Training Participant Designation Change

Continue to track and report training hours provided and completed.

- CCIP will no longer include the designations: “Trainee” and “Advanced Trainee.”
- Report the number of CCIP Participants you work with in the CCIP Year-end Report – CCIP Participants who receive TA/Coaching OR Training.
- Track and report CCIP Training hours in the California ECE Workforce Registry (Registry).
- For any CCIP participants that don’t use the Registry, it’s important that you track their CCIP training and CCIP learning activity participation elsewhere, so you can report this info at year’s end.

CCIP State Match

- All CCIP contractors will continue to receive CCIP State Match funding along with the CCIP Quality contract.
- Beginning in FY 2022-2023, it will no longer be necessary to provide proof of a Local Match or to submit documentation in order to utilize CCIP State Match funds.

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CCIP ARPA

CCIP ARPA is for:

- Home-based child care providers (FFN or FCC) and individuals who are working toward FCC licensure.
- What does it take to be a CCIP participant?
 - Live in the R&R service area
 - Have a CCIP Participant Record (see Pol & Proc doc p. 8)
 - Receive some CCIP TA **and/or** participate in CCIP Training or CCIP Learning Activity
 - Share needs with R&R; what does the CCIP participant say would enable them to re-open, open, expand, or maintain their home-based child care program?

CCIP Strengthens Home-Based Child Care

CCIP Participants are:

- Family Friend Neighbor (FFN) Caregivers or Nannies (License exempt)
- People interested in becoming a FCC Provider
- Individuals working towards FCC Licensure
- Licensed Family Child Care (FCC) Providers
 - Small or Large
 - Operators or Assistants
- Expansion Licensees—FCC Providers who expand their capacity in one or more ways:
 - Re-opening
 - Infant/Toddler
 - Small to Large
 - Non-Traditional Schedule

Planning in Partnership

- **Child care needs assessment:** *What do families need? What are families seeking?*
This is important info to share with CCIP participants who would like to enroll children in their home-based child care program.
- **Assessment of need:** *Why have providers closed? **What do providers/caregivers tell you they need in order to re-open, open, expand or stay open?***
- **R&R supports:** *How will R&Rs support providers with CCIP ARPA funds?*

Planning Considerations



- Assess needs
- Assess capacity
- Strengthen partnerships
- Boost awareness and gather community input
- Create a plan to maximize re-opening and recruitment of new/expansion FCCH Providers & FFN Caregivers; build in opportunities to assess impact and evolving needs
- Update job descriptions, recruit new staff and/or mentors to build capacity
- Share strategies and needs with other R&Rs, the Network, and key partners

Funding: Allowable Expenses

There is more flexibility with CCIP ARPA funds than ongoing CCIP Quality Improvement and State Match funding.

With CCIP ARPA funds, R&Rs may:

- Provide stipends for FFN Caregivers & FCCH Providers
- Purchase incentives for participants, including gift cards
- Provide or pay for training, playgroups, TA, and coaching

Partnerships are encouraged, this includes partnerships with other QI Programs.

CCIP ARPA Requirements

- Capital expenditures by recipients of greater than \$5,000 require prior approval from the state. CCIP contractors should email requests for approval to: ccip@dss.ca.gov.
- CCIP ARPA funds dispersed as stipends or gift cards, are considered taxable income for recipients. Any stipend or gift card valued at \$600+ should have an associated W-9 form.

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Child Care Needs Assessment

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Agenda Items

- Instructional Materials and Supplies (IMS) Grant reminder

Reminders (1 of 3)

- The R&R contract amendments will be processed when the final FY 22-23 budget is approved and signed. Amendments will include \$10 million. There will also be a cost-of-living adjustment applied to the State portion of the original allocation.
- The Federal System for Award Management verifications must be completed annually.
- Invoices must be completed on time for timely payments. Zero balance invoices should also be filed with our office.

Reminders (2 of 3)

- The IMS Grant narrative is required and can be placed on a Word document.
- This narrative is due September 30, 2022, Close of Business
- Information to include in the narrative: Equitable disbursement plan used to disburse IMS; Number of providers and provider type(s); The average funding amount value of the instructional materials and supplies, by provider type; Highlight successes and challenges of this grant opportunity.

Reminders (3 of 3)

- Payment reminder for County Offices of Education or District Offices of Education – payments are made to the County Treasurer's Office.
- IMS grant initial were disbursed. Each grantee received 90 percent of their total award. Possible ten percent reimbursement.

CCIP Updates

- The Network is facilitating the final CCIP end of year narrative reports, and those that have been completed except for a few sites that wanted to complete them on their own. The Network will follow up with those sites.
